Meeting called to order at 6:00 PM (2nd part)

Previous minutes approved, motion by John, seconded by Linda.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by Joann. (refer to copy of report) Most of the checks have cleared for the PAR Course, etc. Bob Lewis was requested to not submit D & O insurance reimbursement to the County of Riverside in the future. Joann has emailed the Tax Assessor's Office, but no reply yet. She is meeting with Larry Ward in May. John moved that ICRC pay the existing tax bill for the ICC property, seconded by Vic. Still working on clarifying tax exemption from the State. will call Attorney General. Portapotty bill for one month will be paid.

Jon Milhouse volunteered to lend his P.A. system and music industry skills to put on family oriented entertainment at the ICC site that would also bring in funds for the ICC. He needs at least three weeks notice to put an event together. His numerous ideas for these events included: auctions, pizza, ice cream, and t-shirt sales, all for fundraising. Also things like bluegrass music, magic, comedy-family oriented, etc. Look for sponsors such as the business round table, etc. His goal would be to have the event paid for BEFORE the actual event. Judy S. suggested "participatory entertainment" for Jon's series because she is working on a grant for that. Vic motioned that Jon proceed, seconded by John S.

Linda asked that ICRC be an official "Supporter" of the Idyllwild Spring Challenge Bike Race by information on the ICRC web site and on the Information Board by the Post Office. The board voted to do it. Motioned by John and Vic.

Vic told the Board about a Cal Fire Grant which may be used for helping to fire abate the ICC site. A wood chipper is needed to make existing wood chips smaller. PAR course is proceeding well, and is also under budget. Judy S. offered to loan her chipper. Home Depot is going to be approached for donations. Lon and John put the finishing touches on three PAR stations as volunteers.

Haunted House agreement rough draft reviewed by the Board. Suggestions about a fire permit copy noted. Final draft to be presented by the next meeting.

Lemon Lily Luau on July 17th, 2-5 PM. Budget of \$200.00 for music, ask Paul Carmen, maybe Sandy Castleberry.

Judy S. talked about Active Arts/Participatory arts possibilities, including visual, musical, physical, and performing art work. Encourage feedback and feeling involved. (Youth internship program might help her out) Ideas such as dance lessons before the concerts this summer. She requested \$45.00 to pay for a symposium.
